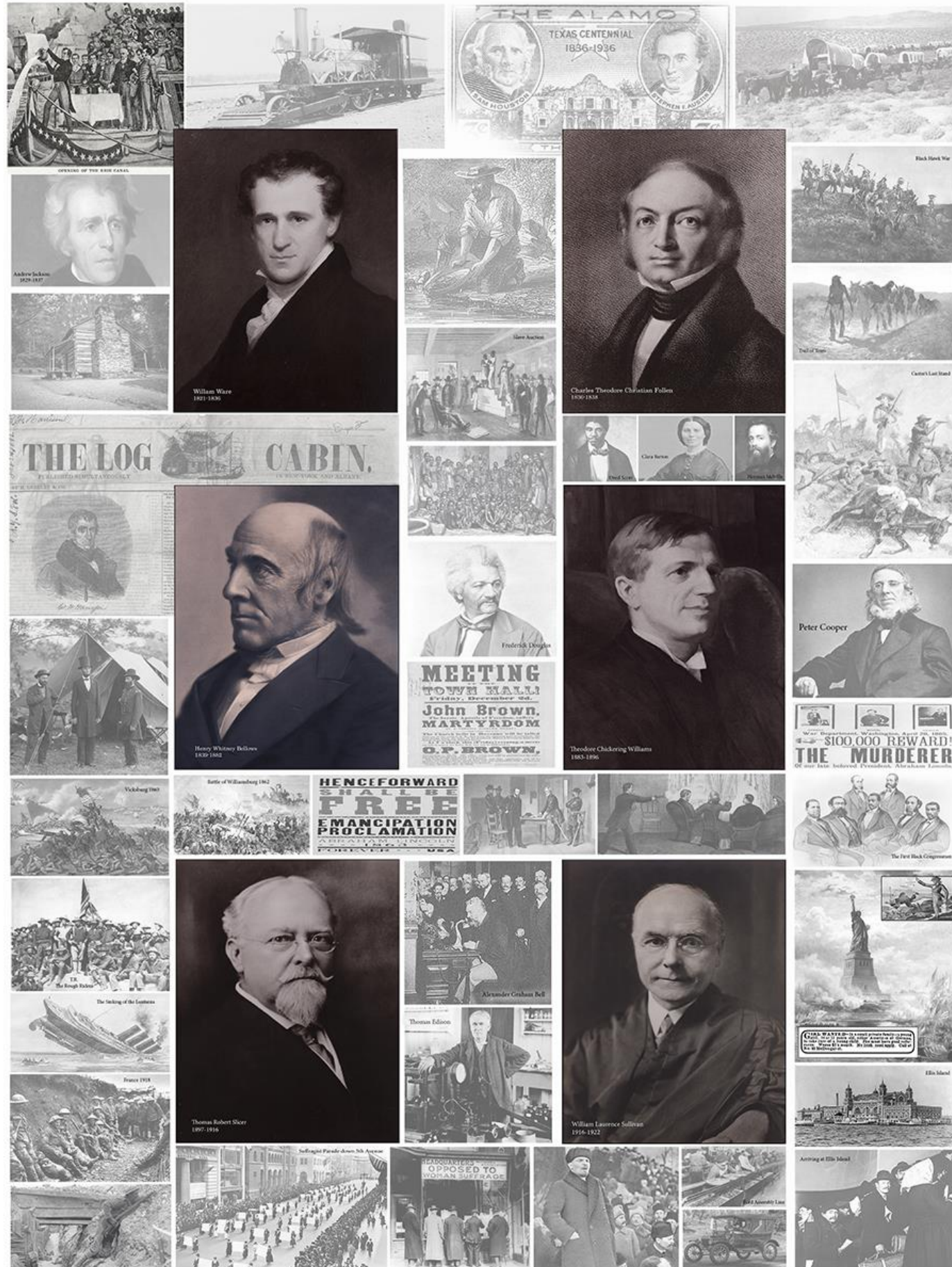

13. Dred Scott, plaintiff in Dred Scott v. Sandford, 3/6/1857. Sued for his freedom and lost in the United States Supreme Court.
14. Clara Barton, Universalist, founder of the American Red Cross, 1881.
15. Herman Melville, 1819-1891, American novelist and member of All Souls.

16. Custer's Last Stand, 1876. Battle of the Little Bighorn, part of the Sioux War.
17. William Henry Harrison, elected President in 1840.
18. Frederick Douglass, 1818-1895, leader of the abolitionist movement in Mass. and N.Y.
19. Peter Cooper, 1818-1895, member of All Souls.
20. Abraham Lincoln with Allan Pinkerton (left) and General John McClernand (right) at Antietam, 1862.
21. Poster: Meeting to mourn and commemorate the death of John Brown, executed on 12/2/1859.
22. Wanted poster: John Surratt, John Wilkes Booth and David Herold, for Lincoln assassination, 4/20/1865.
23. Siege of Vicksburg, 1863.
24. Battle of Williamsburg, 1862.
25. Emancipation Proclamation, 1/1/1863.
