- 45. Al Capone, head of illegal criminal syndicate that illegally supplied bootleg alcohol, imprisoned in 1931 for tax evasion.
- 46. Franklin Delano Roosevelt campaign button. 32nd US President, inaugurated 1933.
- 47. and 48. Adolf Hitler, Fuhrer of Germany, invades Poland, 9/1/1939.
- 49. D-Day, 6/6/1944, American, British and Canadian forces landing in Normandy.
- 50. Ku Klux Klan march down Pennsylvania Avenue, Washington DC, 8/8/1925.
- 51. Black Monday, the Crash of the Stock Market, 10/28/1929. Brooklyn Daily Eagle
- 52. A "flapper"- young women known for energetic freedom, embracing a lifestyle viewed by many as outrageous, immoral or downright dangerous.
- 53. Raising the flag on Iwo Jima, 3/26/1945. Photograph by Joe Rosenthal.
- 54. Soup kitchen line, 1929.

- 56. American B-29 bomber dropped the first atomic bomb on Hiroshima, Japan, 8/6/1945.
- 57. Jackie Robinson breaks the "color line." Hired by Brand Rickie, manager of the NY Dodgers, 1947.
- 58. Liberated prisoners in German concentration camp, 1/27/1945.
- 59. Attack on Pearl Harbor by the Imperial Japanese Air Service, 12/7/1941.
- 60. "We Can Do It" World War II poster produced by J. Howard Miller, 1943.
- 61. "The Kiss" - V-J Day in Times Square. Photographer, Alfred Eisenstaedt.

- 69. HU-1, "Huey" (Helicopter Utility), initially used as troop transporters in Vietnam War, 1961-1975.
- 70. Senator Robert Kennedy campaigning in Los Angeles, 1968. Assassinated 6/5/1968.
- 71. Time Magazine, 11/10/1952. Dwight D. Eisenhower, President, Richard M. Nixon, Vice President.
- 72. President Harry S. Truman relieves General Douglas MacArthur of Command in Korea. General Matthew Ridgeway appointed to replace him, 4/11/1951.
- 73. The 1960s Peace & Love Poster. Vietnam War protestors at the March on the Pentagon, 10/21/1967. Birth Control pills widely available with a prescription.
- 74. Peasants suspected of being Viet Cong. Held by US soldiers.
- 75. Astronaut Neil Armstrong lands on the moon, 7/20/1969.
- 76. Family watching television, 1958. On the screen: Senator Joseph McCarthy consulting Roy Cohen, Esq. at HUAC, the House Unamerican Activities Committee.

77. Bloody Sunday. Officers await demonstrator at the Edmund Pettus Bridge. Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, March, 3/7/1965

78. Stonewall Inn, site of the Stonewall riots, which marked the turning point in the fight for LGBT rights, 6/28/1969.

79. Takeover of US Embassy in Tehran by Iranian students in support of the Islamic Revolution led by Ayatollah Khomeini, 11/4/1979.

80. President Kennedy in the limousine in Dallas, TX, minutes before his assassination, 11/22/1963.

81. Che Guevara and Fidel Castro, 1961.

82. Lyndon Johnson being sworn in on Air Force One as President of the US, 11/23/1963.

83. Richard M. Nixon leaving Washington DC following his resignation as President of US, 8/9/1974.

84. Sandra Day O'Connor, first woman appointed to the Supreme Court. Appointed 1981, resigned 2006.

85. Munich Summer Olympics. 11 Israeli athletes and coaches taken hostage by members of Palestinian Black September, a breakaway faction of the Palestinian organization Fatah.

86. Camp David Accord, framework for historic peace treaty between Israel and Egypt. US President Jimmy Carter, Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin, 9/17/1978.

87. Fall of The Berlin Wall separating East and West Germany, 11/9/1989, marks the fall of the Iron Curtain and communism in Eastern and Central Europe.

88. Initial issue of Ms. Magazine, the first national magazine to make feminist worldview available. Founders: Gloria Steinem and others, July 1972.

89. Campaign poster: Ronald Regan, 1980. President 1981-1989.

90. Bill Gates, founder with Paul Allen of Microsoft Inc., 1975, IPO: 3/13/1986.

91. Montage of symbols of the information age and social media.

92. Steve Jobs, founder with Steve Wozniak of Apple Inc., 1976, IPO: 12/12/1980.

93. President George H W Bush greeting troops in Gulf War, 8/2/1990-2/28/1991. Coalition forces (from 35 countries) expelled Iraq from Kuwait. Codename: Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

94. Statue of Saddam Hussein being toppled in Firdos Square after US invasion of Iraq, 4/9/2003.

95. Space Shuttle Challenger launched, 4/4/1983.

96. Cargo bay camera view of the Hubble Space Telescope at the moment of release, 4/25/1990.

97. AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power (ACT UP) founded 3/1987. Protest march working to end the pandemic of HIV/AIDS, 1987.

98. Oslo Accord I signing ceremony, 9/13/1993. Israeli Prime Minister Itzhak Rabin, Yassir Arafat, President Bill Clinton called for an interim Palestinian government, withdrawal of Israeli forces from Gaza strip and West Bank.

99. Black Lives Matter founded, 2013, in response to the acquittal of Trayvon Martin's murderer. Mission: to combat and counteract white supremacy and build local power supporting the mission.

100. Moments after UA Flight #175 hit the South Tower of The World Trade Center, NYC on 9/11/2001.

101. President George W. Bush addressing the Emergency Rescue Workers from the wreckage of the World Trade Center, 9/14/2001.

102. Aerial view of the Mount Carmel Center, home of the Religious Sect Branch Davidians, besieged by the FBI from 2/28/1993-4/19/93, destroyed by fire. Superimposed: a non-exhaustive list of examples of US attacks that have been referred to as domestic terrorism.

103. President Trump and President Obama with an image of a warming Earth.

104. List of the overall costliest Atlantic hurricanes since 2000 superimposed on an aerial view of the eye of a hurricane.

105. US Marines "humping" (carrying heavy loads) in Afghanistan, November 2001.

106. Lehman Brothers files for Bankruptcy, 9/15/2008. The largest bankruptcy in U.S. history. Subprime mortgage crisis triggered.

107. "Tea Party" founded in 2009, primarily in reaction to the Bank bailout, TARP legislation crafted to rescue the banking system after the 2008 financial collapse.

108. Senator Bernie Sanders and Democratic Presidential Candidate, Hilary Clinton, October 2016.

109. Brett Kavanaugh, an image from the MeToo campaign to stop sexual harassment, and Christine Blasey Ford. Senate Judiciary Committee hearing to consider Kavanaugh's selection to become an Associate Justice of the US Supreme Court, replacing Anthony Kennedy. September, 2019.
